## Niklaus Wirth Award for the Most Valuable Contributor


#### Abstract

At its meeting, the Jury for the Niklaus Wirth Award for the Most Valuable Contributor, made up of Michalis Kamburelis, Primož Gabrijelčič, Michael Philippenko and Antonio Zapater Vera, chaired by Dr. Johannes W. Dietrich and with Emilio Pérez acting as secretary, has decided to grant the Niklaus Wirth Award for the Most Valuable Contributor to Italian software architect Marco Cantù.


Pascal language does not exist in isolation. In order to unleash its true potential and maintain its relevance, it requires complementary features, such as Communities, IDE's and Frameworks. These, when combined with the language itself, combine as the motivating factors for developers to engage with Pascal and write code.
